

Regular Town Meeting of the Town of Lake Tomahawk was held directly after the Budget meeting.

Approve the minutes of the Regular Board Meeting of October 8, October 9 and November 7, 2019. Larry Hoffman made a motion to approve the minutes as written, seconded by Stephanie Sowatzka, all ayes, motion carried.

Approve the payment of bills and vouchers: Motion by Sowatzka and seconded by Hoffman to approve the ACH, EFT, EFTPS payment, check #'s 18148 to 18210 and payroll checks 4657 to 4682 for a total of \$230,480.80, all ayes, motion carried.

Treasurer's Report: During the month of October, The Town had income of \$140.05, which included \$94,592 of applied surplus for the new office addition from the Municipal Building Fund Balance. \$36,175 was received for the quarterly highway aid payment. Cemetery lots were sold for a total of \$1,250. Boat Launch fees and permits totaled \$591. Expenses for October totaled \$232,081. New addition expenses were \$87,590. Road Department expenses totaled \$111,756 including \$21,101 in wages and benefits. \$75,789 was spent for blacktopping Sand Lake Road. George DeMet made a motion to accept the Treasurer's report, seconded by Stephanie Sowatzka, all ayes, motion carried.

County Representative: none present

Public Comment: Hoffman brought up the striping that was not completed by Pitlik and Wick, being done for the same price. Also the broadband tower is erected but no equipment has been placed.

Discuss, approve/modify and adopt the 2020 budget and place the levy on the tax roll. DeMet made a motion to approve the tax levy of \$714,224.00 to be placed on the tax rolls. Sowatzka seconded the motion, all ayes, motion carried.

Fair Mapping question for the April Election Ballot. Catherine Parker spoke on behalf of the following being placed on the April Ballot. DeMet read the proposal: "Shall the Town of Lake Tomahawk adopt the following resolution? Resolved that "we the people" of the Town of Lake Tomahawk, Wisconsin insist upon the creation of a nonpartisan procedure for the preparation of legislative and congressional redistricting plans, and further resolved that the process promotes more accountability and transparency and prohibits the consideration of voting patterns, party information, and incumbent's residence information or demographic information in drawing the maps, except as necessary to ensure minority participation as required by the U. S. Constitution. Vote yes or no. Explanation: A "yes" vote indicates you support creation of a fair nonpartisan redistricting process, while a "no" vote indicates opposition to crating such a process". Stephanie Sowatzka made a motion to approve this resolution to be placed on the April 7, 2020 ballot, Hoffman seconded the motion, all ayes, motion carried.

Reinstate Ordinance 350-5 (operation of all-terrain vehicles on town roads during winter months) and extend renewal date to expire in 2025. Hoffman made a motion to approve the vehicles from the boat landing to downtown area for bait, seconded by DeMet, all ayes, motion carried.

Adopt fees for use of tables and chairs and replacement of fire numbers and posts. Discussion regarding charging Lake Tomahawk residents for tables and chairs. Barb Vetterman spoke and asked if there was a problem getting the tables and chairs back to the Community Center. DeMet stated that at times residents have not returned them promptly. DeMet made a motion to approve a \$100 deposit for the tables and chairs, Hoffman seconded the motion, all ayes, motion carried. DeMet recommended a \$25 replacement cost for a fire number and \$50 if the sign and post needed to be replaced. This is only if there is neglect on the owner's part and not if the sign and/or post is knocked down by the snow plow or another town vehicle. DeMet made a motion regarding the fire number signs and post, seconded by Sowatzka, all ayes, motion carried.
